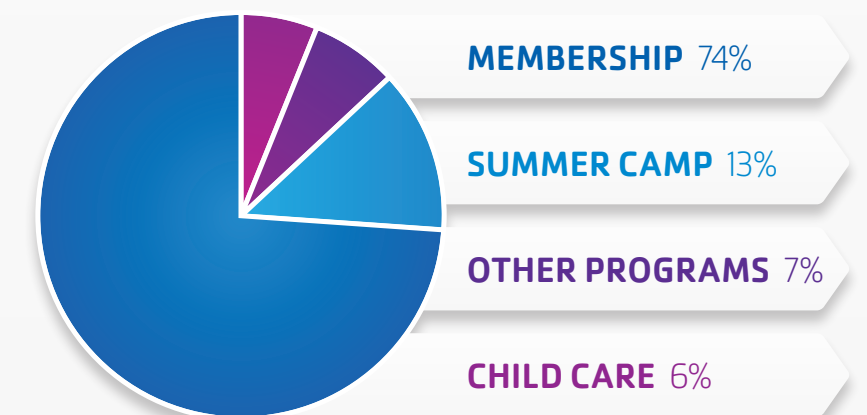

The Y is dedicated to making its programs accessible to all families, regardless of their economic status. Removing cost barriers through financial assistance and sliding-scale fees ensures every child can participate in youth enrichment activities. The Y creates an inclusive environment where all children can grow, learn, and thrive.

\$33,428.20

gave families access to quality child care, creating a safe, nurturing environment for children while supporting parents & guardians in staying engaged with the workforce.

\$39,285.10

supported **470 individuals** through a variety of programs that promote health, build connections, and empower participants to grow and thrive.



\$78,570.30

in financial assistance helped **177 children**, providing access to summer day camp where they gained confidence, built lasting friendships, and experienced opportunities that inspire growth beyond the classroom.

\$437,866.28

made YMCA membership accessible to **2,542 individuals**, empowering them to prioritize their health, connect with others, and thrive in a welcoming community.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

Youth Development at the YMCA focuses on helping young people build confidence, character, and essential life skills through safe, supportive programs. From early learning, and out of school care, to sports and leadership development, the Y builds spaces where young people can discover their strengths, test their limits, and grow into their full potential.



\$11,115.50

gave **181 children** the opportunity to participate in youth sports, where they built confidence, developed teamwork skills, and stayed active in a supportive environment.

\$28,764.90

in financial assistance supported before and after school programs, providing children with a safe, structured environment beyond the school day where they can continue learning and stay engaged.



\$18,902.10

helped **279 swimmers** with critical water safety skills, building confidence and equipping them with lifesaving knowledge.
